


# History

The Institute has been established in the year 2002 in Shimla, once the summer capital of British India and presently the capital of Himachal Pradesh and called the queen of hills and paradise of tourists. The educational institutions of his cosmopolitan centre has been attracting students not only from India but also from the neighboring countries.

Mata Bhakti Devi Welfare Society has been established not only to perform welfare activities but also to impart quality education, especially professional education to the women student community. An enthusiastic group of dedicated and farsighted Philanthropists joined hands to fulfill a mission-to educate the needy & gentle poor masses of the hill state, thereby enabling and empowering them to successfully face the forthcoming multi-facet challenges of the globalised market economy in a befitting manner. A renowned visionary, an academician for excellence, Late Pt. Shaligram Jee, a recipient of the President Award and the State Award in the field of education, was the founder chairman of this society. He has devoted his life to spread education and raise the values of life in society.

Initially B.Ed for Girls and Art & Craft Courses were started in the institute. The tradition of devotion and dedication towards the cause of society has been furthered by Shri Shiv Kumar Dogra, presently the Chairman of College Management Committee. The Institute has made many strides under his dynamic stewardship by adding new courses of D.El. Ed (JBT), BBA, BCA, BSc. Nursing, M.Sc. Chemistry, B.A.LLB. (5 Years) and LL.B (3 Years) in a relatively small span of Five Years. Under his able guidance the institution can boast to have enhanced physical facilities including smart classrooms, Wi-Fi campus, well equipped modern & spacious laboratories, well stocked library and well maintained play ground. Apart from this, recently the hostel facility for 100 girls has also been added. The institution is also providing transport facility from Shimla to its day scholars.



Shimla is Capital Town of Himachal Pradesh. It was formerly the summer capital during the British Rule. The town of Shimla is built over several hills and connecting ridges. The important hills are Jakhu (8050 ft), Prospect Hill (7140 ft), Observatory Hill (7050 ft), Elysium Hill (7400 ft), and Summer Hill (6900 ft), There is a great controversy over the origin of the name Shimla. The name Shimla was derived from 'Shyamalaya' meaning blue house said to be the name of house built of blue slate by a faquir on Jakhu. According to one version Shimla takes one it name form 'Shamla' meaning a blue female another name for Godess. The place was on the Jakhu Hillside, there was a temple of Godess kali. During the British period the idol of the Goddess was shifted to a new place, now famous Kali Bari Temple. It was only in 1819 A.D. that the then Assistant Political Agent of hill states Lt. Ross set up first British residence. His successor Lt. Charles Patt Kennedy' errected the first pucca house in 1822 named after Lt. Kennedy as Kennedy House'.

Shimla has been blessed with all the natural bounties, one can think of. Dwelling on a panoramic location, the hill town is surrounded by green pastures and snow-capped peaks. The spectacular cool hills accompanied by the structures made during the colonial era create an aura, which is very different form other hill stations. Shimla retains its colonial heritage, with grand old buildings, among them are the stately Viceregal Lodge, Charming iron lamp posts and Anglo-Saxon names. The Mall, packed with shops and eateries, is the center of attraction of the town and scandal point associated with former Maharaja of Patiala's escapads, offers a view of distant snow clad peaks. In 1946 leaders of the Indian nationalist movement came to Shimla for a crucial conference that paved the way to Independence. Shimla's legacy of British control has left in somewhat of Aesthetic anomaly: an Indian town, a state capital, no less taht looks and feels like a village in Northern England.

In 1864 Shimla was declared as the summer capital of India. After Independence Shimla became the capital of Punjab and is presently the capital of Himachal Pradesh.

B. A. LL. B course is affiliated to H. P. University Shimla and approved by Bar Council of India in the year 2015. The institute has been allotted 60 seats per semester for the course

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**-

- Plus two in Arts, Science and Commerce from a recognized board.
- Minimum marks criteria is 50% marks for General Category and 45% marks SC/ST
- (However the eligibility criteria for admission as per HP University norms.)

#### Fee Structure:-

Fee structure for B.A. LL.B. course will be as prescribed by H.P. University or H.P. Govt. from time to time. The H.P. University charges regarding examination related expenses, examination fee, migration/Registration fee etc. will be charged separately as applicable from time to time.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

Bachelor's degree in any stream (B.A., B. Com., B.Sc) established by law in India with at least 45% marks general and 40% marks for SC/ST

In service candidates must apply through proper channel along with the certificate of leave from his employer for the complete duration of course. However, in case of employment in private sector, No Objection Certificate (NOC) and other related documents, such as appointment letter and leave certificate from the employer/competent authority must be submitted. (However the eligibility criteria for admission as per HP University norms.)

#### **Fee Structure**

Fee structure will be as prescribe by the H.P. University / H.P. Govt form time to time The H.P. University charges including Examination related expenses, Migration/Registration fee etc. will be charged separately as applicable from time to time.

### **REGISTRATION WITH THE UNIVERSITY**

Every Student not registered with H.P. University, admitted in this institute for B.Ed., M.Ed., B.B.A., B.C.A., B.Sc. Nursing, M.Sc. Chemistry, B.A.LL.B shall be required to get himself/herself registered with the H.P. University Shimla on payment of requisite fee.

No migration is allowed. Only mutual migration is allowed.

#### STUDENT WELFARE ACTIVITIES

For the student welfare activities, a provision has been made out of the contribution received from the student & staff of the institute and the collection from other sources. This little contribution is expected to go a long way extending a helping hand/financial assistance to poor & deserving students.

#### THE MAIN OBJECTIVES ENVISAGED ARE:

- 1. To render financial assistance to the poor and deserving students or payment of Tuition Fees, Examination fees, Purchase of text books, stationary etc.
- To meet any other need of the students considered to be genuine by the Authorised Committee of the institute for the purpose.
- 3. Provided that the funds shall not be utilized for award of scholarships / fellowships OR stipends OR for payments on prizes, rewards etc. to students.

A student requiring financial assistance shall apply on the prescribed form through the Head of Department of their course of his / her study to Director-cum-Principal of the Institute.

#### LIBRARY RULES

I) Each Student is allowed two books at a time for a period of one week. At the time of returning of books, the librarian may decide whether to reissue the book or not. A fine of Rs. 5/- per Book per day is charged for books kept overtime.



- Leave from college does not imply exemption from return of books. It is the sole responsibility of the student to return the book in time.
- iii) Reference books, text books, rare books, current periodicals and magazine shall be issued in the library premises only.
- iv) If a book is found mutilated, damaged, teared, folded or defaced in any manner, the last borrower is required to replace the book or pay double price as damages. Any defect noticed at the time of borrowing the books, must be brought to the notice of the librarian immediately.
- v) Student must follow the library rules strictly.
- vi) They must show/ present identity card when asked for.
- vii) Polite and courteous behavior inside the library is expected from all the students.

  Silence must be observed inside the library.
- viii) Students are encouraged to use the library as much as possible.
- ix) In case Library Card is lost by the student. Duplicate Card can be issued on payment of Rs. 50.00.
  In such cases the library card holder shall be held responsible for all the books shown to be outstanding in his original library card.

#### **Conduct Rules**

- 1. Students will be required to conform to the Rules and Regulations of the college which may be issued from time to time. They are also expected to maintain discipline, a proper standard in and outside the college. Authority of the college extends over every student on its roolls, at all times and in all places. They will be required to observe and obey the rules and regulations of the institute issued from time to time. The Principal and all the members of the staff have the authority and the duty to ensure punctuality/ discipline amongst the students.
- Ragging in and outside the Institute premises is strictly for bidden. Defaulters will be prosecuted in accordance with law.
- All students are expected to be modest, neat and tidy in dress avoiding expensive clothes and exaggerated fashions and colour schemes. Each student will be required to adhere to dress code prescribed by the institute. They will be allowed to wear the dress of their choice only on every Wednesday.



- 4. Taking drugs/ liquor smoking is strictly prohibited in the institute campus.
- Continuous absence from the college without permission for a period exceeding seven days shall entail striking off the name on the institute rolls. On readmission, admission fee and other charges as applicable well be charged.
- 6. Fine will be charged for any absence from the classes as decided by the Principal.
- House examinations are compulsory. A student absenting from House Examinations will not be permitted to appear in the annual examination
- 8. Cell phones are not allowed in the institute.
- Any damage to college property will be made good from the erring student. They are supposed not to write or deface the furniture/ fixture. Defaulter will be fined heavily.
- 10. Any dispute out of the premises of the institute will not be the liability of the college.
- 11. Morning Assembly is compulsory for all.
- 12. Every student is expected to carry her/ his Identity Card daily.
- 13. No Student is to leave college premises on working days before the classes are over. The College is not responsible for any unwanted act of omission or commission of any student committed even outside the college premises.
- 14. On working days, the students desirous of leaving the college premises for one reason OR the other shall have to obtain written permission from the Principal. The permission will be granted on recommendations of the concerned Head of Department, thereafter the required Gate Pass will be issued.
- Fee once deposited shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 16. The Principal may from time to time, supplement these rules, as the need arises. The supplements will be pasted on notice board.
- 17. At the time of admission in the college the parents/ guardians of the candidates should be present,. The are expected to furnish an undertaking to the effect that in case their ward son/ daughter is found guilty of indulging in any type of antisocial activities/ ragging in and outside the college campus OR Hostel as the case may be he / she will be held responsible for any disciplinary action/ rustication by the college authority.
- 18. The candidate who attends regularly, teaching/practical classes and fulfill the condition of minimum 75% attendance in all the courses shall be permitted to sit the in the final examination as per HP Univrsity norms, and min. 90 % attendance required for D.El. Ed. (JBT) Students as per norms of HP School Education Board.
- 19. Students will have to follow the Rules and Regulations of the Institute.
- 20. Students will have to fulfill the required conditions of Lectures, in the college and in case of shortage of lectures appropriate action can be initiated against him/her.
- During study, student can't join any employment whether permanent or temporary in Govt. / private sector.



## **HOSTEL FACILITIES**

- म The Institute has excellent Hostel facilities exclusively for about 100 Girls, in its hostels at Hari Devi and at Mount View, Near R.K.M.V. Longwood, Shimla.
- In view of limited seats in the Girls Hostel of the Institute the candidates should clearly understand that grant of admission to any programme of study in the institute would not ensure allotment of Hostel accommodation. Accommodation will be offered to the eligible applicants subject to availability.

## **Hostel Conduct Rules**

- All the girl students desirous of Hostel Accommodation will be required to apply in the prescribed application form obtainable from the Hostel in-charge of the institute, immediately after their admission to the institute.
- Hostel residents are expected to observe the rules & regulations prescribed for them by the institute from time to time, as well as all the requirements of corporate life and the social norms that living together demands.
- 3. They are also expected to maintain discipline, a proper standard in and outside the Hostel. Authority of the college extends over every student on its rolls, at all times and in all places.
- 4. The Principal and all the members of the staff have the authority and the duty to ensure punctuality / discipline amongst the students during college time/hours
- Ragging in and outside the Hostel premises is strictly forbidden. Defaulters will be prosecuted in accordance with law.
- 6. Taking drugs/liquor smoking is strictly prohibited in the Hostel.
- 7. Any damage o Hostel property will be made good from the erring student. They are supposed not to write on deface the furniture/ fixture. Defaulters will be fined heavily.
- 8. Preparation/ cooking of any Food items in the rooms is strictly prohibited.
- Use of Heaters, Immersion Rods OR any extra electrical equipments without the permission of the hostel warden are strictly prohibited. However any damage caused to the wiring of the rooms has to be compensated by defaulter.
- 10. Failure to observe discipline OR violation of rules may make a student liable to disciplinary action, which may result in the withdrawal of hostel facilities.



- 11. No INMATE of the HOSTEL is expected to stay outside without obtaining the written permission of the HOSTEL WARDEN. Any student found absent without permission will be liable to face disciplinary action, as is proposed by the Disciplinary Committee of the institute, which may be in the form of FINE ranging from Rs. 100/- to Rs. 500/- OR it may even lead to the eviction of the defaulting student from the hostel.
- 12. In case, it is found at any later stage that wrong information has been furnished OR some material/ facts have been concealed, the student is liable to eviction from the hostel, besides such other action which the institute may deem fit will be taken against the defaulting student.
- 13. At the time of admission in the college Hostel, the parents/ guardians of the candidates should be present. Once the student joins the hostel cannot leave before the end of the session.
- 14. The declaration in respect of Local Guardian authorized to visit the student residing in the hostel will be made by the parents only on the prescribed admission form at the time of admission. The photographs of the local guardians also will have to be fixed/pasted on the admission form.
- 15. All the Hostel residents are expected to strictly observe the following mess timings:
- 1) BREAKFAST TIME: 8:00 AM. TO 8:30 AM.
- LUNCHTIME: 1:00 PM. TO 2:00 PM.
   (To be served in the canteen of the institute on all working days except holidays).
- 3) TEATIME: 5:00 PM. TO 5:15 PM.
- 4) DINNERTIME: 8:00 PM. TO 8:30 PM.
- 5) ATTENDANCE TIME: 8:00 PM.
- 6) TIME TO WATCH TELEVISION: 8:00 PM. TO 9:30 PM.

  N.B. (The Dinning hall will be closed at 9:30 PM.)
- 16. Only visitors as authorized by the parents of student will be allowed to visit the student in the visiting hours (i.e. Winter 4 pm. to 6 pm and Summer 5 pm. to 7 pm.)
- 17. In view of water scarcity, INMATES of the HOSTEL are expected to use water economically. Water supply will be available for the inmates for 3 hours only (i.e. from 6 pm. to 9 pm.). The timing may change as per the decision of the competent authority.
- 18. The Hostel Fee (including mess fee) once deposited will not to be refunded nor adjusted.
- 19. The parents would have to submit their written consent for any outside stay of their ward residing in the hostel especially during night. Any student who remains outside the hostel without permission and commits some undesirable activity, the college will not be responsible for the same.
- 20. The Principal may time to time supplement these rules, as the need arises. The supplements will be pasted on the notice board.
